## The 2024 Golden D-Cup shines as 'The Show of Champions'

#### **GOLDEN D-CUP ALL-GLOSTER SHOW**

THE fifth edition of the Golden D-Cup took place on December 7, 2024 at Project House Hall in Floriana, Malta, cementing its reputation as a premier event in the Gloster canary world, reports Mario Zahra.

This year's show featured an impressive 245 exhibits, each embodying the pinnacle of excellence, solidifying the title "The Show of Champions."

The event was honoured to welcome renowned IGBA panel judge Joel Cordeiro from Portugal, who returned to Malta to lend his expertise for the fifth anniversary of the competition.

Over the years, Joel has developed a strong rapport

with Maltese fanciers, who were delighted to see him back on the island to judge this remarkable show for the first time. Joel expressed his excitement upon being invited, noting that the Golden D-Cup Gloster show has earned a reputation as one of the most organised and professionally presented competitions in the Gloster community worldwide.

# Top honours and outstanding performances

Justin Calleja, who happens to be a novice exhibitor, stole the spotlight claiming the title of best Gloster in show with a magnificent unflighted (UF) three-parts-dark (TPD) corona hen. He also secured best opposite head in show with an exquisite variegated buff consort hen, showcasing a level of quality that could have easily taken the top prize.

The aggregate champion title was awarded to Frank Formosa, who accumulated an impressive 170 points and triumphed in nine of the 27 official standard classes, demonstrating consistency and mastery in his show team. Frank also won best variegated buff in show.

### Additional highlights and winners

Peter Falzon achieved third best in show, best consort cock, and best white, further establishing his prominence in the competition. Herman Demicoli excelled with his entries, winning best corona
